

Escambia County RESTORE MYIP Process



On 4/16 the RAC requested the BCC provide guidance on 4 policy points; the BCC discussed and considered the following:

Request	Direction
1. Approve the selection criteria and scoring recommended by RAC	Sent back to RAC for consideration of revisions to language and/or point weighting for ADA criteria, Leveraging, Tourism and Seafood promotion.
2. Discuss and provide guidance to the Committee relating to the following:	
a. Amending Resolution R2012-150, as amended in Resolution R2014-80, to include specific RESTORE Act language of Tourism and Seafood Promotion, as provided in H.R. 4348-186;	Passes
 b. Determine whether all projects are to be scored against each other or only scored within specific categories (Economic, Infrastructure, and Environment); 	Passes - Score all projects against all criteria

Request	Direction
c. Sponsoring or partnering with groups that cannot develop a project on their own;	No Action
 d. Offering sub-grant funds and/or County procurement for selected projects; and 	No Action
e. Allocating funding set-asides or not for specific categories.	% Set-asides will not be included for specific project categories



ADA and other regulatory compliance – no points allocated


Note regarding regulatory compliance: Project submittals must conform to all applicable federal, state, and local laws and codes including, but not limited to American's with Disabilities Act, Rehabilitation Act of 1973, U.S. Access Board, National Environmental Policy Act, National Historic Preservation Act, Davis-Bacon Act, Florida Building Code, and the Escambia County Land Development Code. Projects that do not comply will not be considered for scoring and will be returned to the submitter.



BC Baseline Criteria (Regulatory and Programmatic) -- ALL submitted projects Subtotal must meet the minimum criteria in this category 15 12 1. Project Justification. Proposed project is adequately described to determine feasibility # of av. and the budget includes reasonable and justifiable costs. Points 3 Criteria Guidance Project budget provides detailed expenditure plan Costs are practical and are appropriately aligned with project activities Proposed project includes all supporting documentation to justify proposal

Leveraging of funds – increase to 7 points

10. Leverages funds. Proposed project provides for in kind or other supplemental funding, increasing fund leveraging. leverages funds by qualifying for additional funding; submitter can demonstrate additional funding commitment connected to the project.

Definition provided for "in-kind" matching funds

15. <u>In-kind matching funds – non-cash donations in the form of real property, equipment, supplies, services, and qualified salaries and wages consistent with federal guidance</u>

- Tourism, Seafood Promotion, Recreational Fishing
 - No changes recommended

Summary of Recommendations

- Adopt Version 1.7 Escambia County Project Selection Criteria
 - Regulatory Compliance Points Removed Moved to Prerequisite; Baseline Category Max Points Revised from 15 Points to 12 Points
 - Leveraging criteria wording clarifications
 - "In-kind match" definition provided
 - Leveraging criteria point allocation revised from 2 points to 7 points
 - New Max Points = 72
 - New Max Bonus Points = 28
 - New Max Total Points = 100
