
2. Click Register




3. Fill out the directed information.




4. Login with the account you just created.




Restore Act

On April 20, 2010, the largest offshore oil spill in the United States occurred, exacerbating the effects of previous natural disasters. Oil flowed unchecked for three months. The cause was an explosion of the Deepwater Horizon, an oil rig drilling in the Gulf of Mexico. Before the well was capped, millions of barrels of crude oil were released, closing tens of thousands of square miles of federal waters to fishing, and causing extensive damage to marine and wildlife habitats, and tourism.

On July 6, 2012, the President signed into law the Resources and Ecosystems Sustainability, Tourist Opportunities, and Revived Economies of the Gulf Coast States Act (RESTORE Act; Subtitle F of Public Law 112-141). The Act established the Gulf Coast Restoration Trust Fund in the U.S. Treasury Department. Eighty percent of the civil penalties paid after July 6, 2012, under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act in connection with the Deepwater Horizon oil spill will be deposited into the Trust Fund and invested. Under the Act, amounts in the Trust Fund will be available for programs, projects, and activities that restore and protect the environment and economy of the Gulf Coast region.

Treasury is responsible for issuing compliance and auditing procedures for the entire Act and procedures for two grant programs administered by Treasury. These procedures became effective October 14, 2014 as an Interim Final Rule. Separately, Treasury published an Interim Final Rule, effective October 14, 2014 that allocates shares to individual Louisiana parishes under the Direct Component.

Under the Act, Treasury will administer two grant programs, called the Direct Component and






11. The Downloads tab will give you access to the application in a printable format as well as example documents.




12. When you are ready to begin inputting your project, click the projects tab.




13. Click the add projects button.

15. Search for a location by adding the address and click search.




16. A red dot will pop up on the map. To move it to the exact project location (or admin building), click the blue button with the pencil to the far right of the legend. The red dot will turn yellow when you are able to drag it to a new location.

Where will the Project take place? (e.g. County, city/town name or zip code at a minimum. You may enter full or partial addresses as well.)


Save Location

A Marker was added to the map. You can click the edit tool and click and drag the Marker to move it to the desired location.



18. Next, click the Step 2- Project Form tab.




19. Fill out the application. For questions that do not apply, please put N/A. Click Save Details when complete.


